Political veteran Mwai Kibaki claimed victory in controversial presidential elections in December 2007 sparking widespread violence throughout Kenya. His swearing-in for a second term in office prompted a wave of unrest across the country.

The UN says 1,000,000 people have been displaced by the unrest, which is also affecting the economies of neighboring Uganda and Rwanda. The UN also reports that men, women and children are being raped as a weapon and girls are forced to trade sex for food and protection.
