PhD in Nursing Fellowship
Spring 2007

Purpose:

The PhD in Nursing Fellowship is designed to recognize outstanding students in our program and support their academic progress.

Award:

For Spring 2007, each PhD in Nursing Fellowship award may be up to the amount for tuition and required fees. Awards may not exceed the full amount of students' tuition and required fees.

Criteria for Grant Qualification:

- a. Enroll full-time in the PhD in Nursing Program;*
- b. Maintain satisfactory academic standing;

Application Process:

To apply for the PhD in Nursing Fellowship, students complete the following steps:

- a. Write a cover letter with a statement confirming full-time status, including a listing of courses to be taken in the Spring.
- b. Write an Academic Goals Statement (approximately one page) to describe their overall research goals and specific goals for the Spring semester;
- c. Prepare a budget justification page to show the full amount of tuition and required fees for Spring 2007. Include the source and amount of any other financial support for tuition and fees for Spring 2007 in budget description.
- d. E-mail or hand carry the cover letter and Academic Goals Statement by **January 8, 2008** to:

*"Graduate students are considered full time if they are enrolled in at least 9 credits per semester, or if they hold a full time assistantship (20 hours a week) and are enrolled in at least 6 credits per semester. Graduate students who are enrolled in dissertation credits (either 998 or 999) are considered full time if they are enrolled in at least 6 credits per semester, regardless of whether they hold an assistantship. Graduate students who have completed the minimum number of credits required by their degree program, including the minimum number of credits of 999 required by their degree program, are considered full time if they are registered for at least 1 credit of 999, and their advisors and department chairs certify each semester that they are working full time on the dissertation." **Mason Catalog page 42.**
