The master of public health (MPH) is the most widely recognized professional degree for those working in the field of public health. George Mason University's MPH program requires coursework in all core disciplines of public health—epidemiology, biostatistics, health administration and management, the social and behavioral sciences, and environmental health—as well as additional coursework within the chosen concentration area and the completion of a practicum or research project. MPH concentrations include community health, epidemiology, global health, and public health administration.

Global health is the study of health problems that extend across borders. Professionals working in global health need to be familiar with a wide range of issues, including infectious disease, nutrition, environmental health, the social and cultural factors that influence health and health behavior, and health policy and management. The **global health concentration** gives students the opportunity to develop knowledge and skills in all these areas through both course work and practical experiences. Students completing this concentration will be prepared to design, implement, monitor, and manage global health programs.

## Admission Requirements

Admission to the program is competitive, and a variety of criteria is evaluated in the admissions process: the strength of the undergraduate record and any post-baccalaureate course work, the GRE general examination, professional goals and experience, letters of recommendation, and evidence of the ability to write and conduct research at the graduate level. Some background in statistics, biology, and the social sciences is preferred. Applications to the degree program are made through CHHS.

## Application Deadline

Application deadlines for the MPH program are March 1 for the fall semester and November 1 for spring. Late applications will be considered on a space-available basis. Application materials are available at <http://admissions.gmu.edu/grad>.
